To all to whom these presents shall come whereas William
 Joyner of the county of Southampton by his last
 Indentures of Mortgage bearing date the fourteenth day of
 September 1786 did sell and convey unto Lewis Joyner
 and Henry Jones and to their heirs one certain tract or
 parcel of Land whereon the said William Joyner then dwelt
 lying in the county aforesaid containing one hundred & twenty
 Acres—Interest of the consideration and securing and saving
 harmless the said Lewis Joyner and Henry Jones and their
 heirs and assigns in becoming bound as security with the
 said William Joyner unto William Scott for the payment of
 One Hundred and Forty Nine Pounds eighteen shillings
 and two pence with interest thereon from the 25th day of May
 1707 with a proviso of Redemption and whereas the said William
 Joyner hath satisfied and secured unto the said Lewis Joyner
 and Henry Jones the sum of one hundred and twenty pounds
 part of the aforesaid sum—Now know ye that the
 said Lewis Joyner and Henry Jones for the consideration
 aforesaid have and by these presents do convey release
 and forever quit claim unto the aforesaid William Joyner
 and to his heirs and assigns all the right title interest
 claim or demand of theirs the said Lewis Joyner and
 Henry Jones their executors Administrators &c
