his heirs Executors & Administrators and assigns by these presents
hath bargained granted sold Almed enfeoffed & confirmed by
these presents doth bargain grant sell almed enfeoff and confirm
unto the said James Johnson & to his heirs & assigns forever all
that Tract or parcel of land lying and being in the aforesaid
parish of Notaway & County of Southampton and bounded
as followeth to wit beginning at a poplar a line tree of Rolls
Johnson by the side of the road a bout branch thence along
a line of Marked Trees to a White ash by the side of seacocke
swamp thence down the side seacocke swamp to the mouth
of the road a bout branch thence up the said branch Pre-
