This Indenture made the 21th day of July in the year of our Lord One Thousand seven hundred Eighty Eight Between Matthew Williamson and Wife Elizabeth N Carolina and County of - Hartfort of the one part and William Worrell late of the County of Southampton (and state of Virginia) of the other part Witnesseth that the said Matthew Williamson for and in consideration of the sum of One hundred Pounds Current Money of Virginia to him in hand paid by the said William Worrell the receipt whereof the said Matthew Williamson doth hereby acknowledge hath granted bargained and sold aliened enfeoffed Confirmed and by these presents doth grant bargain and sell alien Enfeoff and Confirm unto the said William Worrell his heirs and assigns forever One Certain Tract or parcel of Land lying or being in The County of Southampton aforesaid Containing by Estimation One hundred and thirteen Acres be the same more or less and bounded as followeth to wit) beginning at a large ancient marked Willow Oak in Arons Branch a corner of Nicks Boons land thence along his line the better Dam Swamp and down the swamp to Olive Simmons thence along her line to John Edwardses line then Edwardses line to Barton Taylors line then along the said Taylors line to Nicholas Boons line thence along the said Boons line to the beginning with all Trees woods under woods Common Law Common of pasture profits Commodities advantages Emfluments and herbageents whatsoever to the
