Simmons and Thomas Ridley the whereas Richard Johnson
and Lucy his wife have by their certain indentures of bargain
and sale conveyed unto John Maglamera the said simple estate
land in one certain tract or parcel of land situated lying and
being in the said County on the south side of Potomac river containing
by estimation Fifty acres more or less and whereas the said Lucy
cannot conveniently travel to the Court of our said County to make
acknowledgment of the same these require you to go personally
to the said Lucy and to receive her acknowledgements of the
same and examine her privately apart from her husband
whether she does the same freely and voluntarily without
repression or threat of her said husband and whether
she is willing that the said indenture with this Commission
annexed should be recorded in the Court of Saukhampton
and when you have examined her as aforesaid that you
distinctly and plainly certify us thereof under your hands
and seals returning to us this writ Witness Saml Kello Clerk
of our said Court at the Court house the 15th day of Feb^r 1789 & in
the 13th Year of the Commonwealth

Agreeable to a Commission To us directed bearing date the
9th January 1789 we the subscribers met at the house of Rich^d
Johnson and did proceed to take the Examination of Lucy
Johnson wife of the said Rich^d & she being apart from her
said husband did freely & voluntarily Relinquish her
right of dower in the land conveyed in the said Deed
given under our hand this 15th day of January 1789
