other part witnesseth that for and in Consideration of the sum of
ninety pounds Current money which he the said Silas Kirby is justly
indebted to the said Joseph and William Scott and William Vaughan
and honestly desires to secure and pay to them and for and in the
further Consideration of the sum of five Shillings the money to be
said Silas Kirby in hand paid by the said Kirby and before
the sealing and delivery of this the receipt whereof do hereby ac
know ledge and thereof and every part thereof do exonerate and
discharge I the said Silas Kirby have granted bargained sold
and confirmed to the said Joseph and William Scott and William
Vaughan his heirs and assigns forever one certain tract of land
lying and being in the County of Southampton and on the south side
and adjoining the aforesaid Swamp being the plantation
whereon the said Silas Kirby lies containing by estimation One
hundred acres more or less known by the Customary Bounds
with all the appurtenances belonging or in any wise appertaining
to the premises hereby granted or intended to be granted and
the reversion and reversions remainder and remainders and
all services benefits and profits of the said land & premises
and all my right claim Interest and securities relating to
the same to have and to hold the said tract of land and
other premises unto the said Joseph and William Scott & William
Vaughan their heirs and assigns forever to the only proper
use and behoof of them the said Joseph and William Scott and
William Vaughan their heirs and assigns forever and the
said Silas Kirby doth hereby grant for himself and his heirs that
he the said Silas Kirby his heirs and every of them shall
