 seal this third day of September in the year of our Lord one
 thousand seven hundred and eighty eight —

 five pounds four & six pence Current money by the said Richard Vick
 to the said Jefo Arrington in hand paid at or before the sealing
 delivering of these presents the receipt whereof the said Jefo Arrington
 and Martha his wife doth hereby acknowledge and acquit and discharge
 the said Richard Vick his Heirs and assigns for ever by these presents
 they the said Jefo Arrington and Martha his wife hath granted
 bargained and sold aliened and Conveyed unto the said Richard Vick
 his Heirs and assigns forever and certain Tract of
