

This Indenture made this fifth day of September 1702 Between  
 William Edmunds and his wife Martha of Southampton County of the one part  
 and Edmund Turner of the other part witnesseth that the said William Edmunds  
 and his wife Martha for and in Consideration of the sum of Two hundred and  
 eighty one pounds five shillings Current Money of Virginia to them in hand  
 paid by the said Edmund Turner the receipt whereof we the said Wm.  
 Edmunds and Martha his wife do hereby acknowledge hath Bargained -  
 granted and sold and by these presents do grant Bargain and sell unto  
 the said Edmund Turner his heirs and assigns one certain Tract or parcel  
 of land situate lying and Being in the County of Southampton and  
 Containing by Survey seven hundred and seventy five acres more or less  
 one acre of which land lying & joining in front of Wm Ann Edmunds  
 and Henry Turners Mill is by me accepted & to be ever considered  
 for the use of the said Mill &c The land is bounded as follows to wit  
 Beginning at a corner red oak in Howell Edmunds old Line by the  
 side of the great path leading from the old Plantation where Wm Ann  
 Edmunds now lives then running with the said line south 15 Degrees East  
 114 Poles to a gum on the head of the Deep run Branch then up the said  
 branch by a line of marked Trees west 76 Pole then south 15 Degrees East  
 74 Pole to a pine then by a line of Marked Trees in Howell Edmunds  
 line No. 70 degrees East 50 Pole to a red oak thence 12 Degrees East  
 50 pole to a pine in Howell Edmunds line then S $\frac{1}{2}$  45 Degrees East 64 Pole  
 to a corner pine Stump in the head of a small Branch leading into  
 the pole Branch ten down the said branch S $\frac{1}{2}$  0 deg wt 40 Pole  
 to the pole Branch then down the said branch S $\frac{1}{2}$  40 Degrees 8 $\frac{1}{2}$  98  
 pole to the saw scaffold at a Broken top pine by the side of the 2 $\frac{1}{2}$   
 pole branch and a corner between myself Howell Edmunds  
 and John Francis then N $\frac{1}{2}$  45 Degrees East 106 Pole to a pine in John  
 Francis line then S $\frac{1}{2}$  74 Degrees E $\frac{1}{2}$  32 Pole by the J. Francis line  
 then S $\frac{1}{2}$  16 degrees E $\frac{1}{2}$  100 pole to a corner pine by by S. Francis  
 thence then S $\frac{1}{2}$  60 degrees E $\frac{1}{2}$  140 pole a crof the pole Branch by  
 Balmers corn field Then N $\frac{1}{2}$  45 Degrees East 200 pole to Ropes  
 swamp below the mill then up the said swamp leaving one  
 acre of land in front of the mill 170 pole to the mouth of the  
 deep run Branch then up the said Branch S $\frac{1}{2}$  85 Degrees
