me in making and defending the right and title of a Negro man & woman the
property of the estate of Drawing Parker dec'd with Wm Parker of North Carolina
I do hereby for their safety do devise myself my heirs Executors or administrators
and assigns of any right to claim or dispose of my Negro woman Judith
or of the Negro or Negroes purchased with the Fifty five pounds £. which
the above slave was sold for or any other part of my estate when if the
disposing of it may in dainger the above mentioned Knight and Newsum
and do hereby in a special and particular manner now and at all times
hereafter in vest the above mentioned Knight and Newsum their heirs
Executors administrators or assigns with Full Power to hold and claim
a power of disposing of the above mentioned Judith or the Negro or Negroes
purchased with the above mentioned money or any other of my estate in
case of the above mentioned Negro or Negroes to be purchased with the before
mentioned money witnefs my hand and seal this Eleventh day of September
one thousand seven hundred and eighty nine
