This Indenture made this eleventh day of February in the year
of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety Between William Morrell
and Barbary his wife of the County of Southampton of the one part and Barton
Taylor of the County aforesaid of the other part Witnesseth that the said
William Morrell and Barbary his wife for and in consideration of the sum
of Sixty seven pounds sixteen shillings Current Money of Virginia to them
in hand paid the receipt whereof they the said William Morrell & Barbary
his wife doth acknowledge hath bargained sold aliened enfeoffed and
confirmed unto the said Barton Taylor and to his heirs and assigns forever
all that tract or parcel of land situate lying and being in the County of
Southampton containing one hundred and thirteen Acres and bounded as
followeth Beginning at a willow oak in Arons Branch a corner of
Nicholas Boons Land thence along the said Boons line to Beaver Dam
Swamp and down the said swamp to Oliver Simmons line thence along
the said line to John Edwards line thence along said Taylor line to Nicholas
Boons line thence along the said Boons line to the beginning Together with
all houses orchards woods ways waters and water courses privileges
hereditaments and appurtenances therunto belonging or in any wise
appertaining To have and to hold the said granted land and premises
to the only proper use and behoof of him the said Barton Taylor his
heirs and assigns forever and the said William Morrell and Barbary his
wife doth for themselves their heirs executors and administrators covenant
and agree with the said Barton Taylor that he the said Barton Taylor
his heirs and assigns shall have hold use occupy and enjoy the said
granted land and premises free from the claim or claims of all and
every person or persons whatsoever and they the said William
