County for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred pounds Current Money
of Virginia to me in hand paid have bargained sold and remised unto John
Marks (my son) two good Mares eleven Head of Cattle Six Sows & Piggs -
Five Sheep my proper Bear Mark Five Feather Beds and furniture two
Chests two Spinning wheels one Flax wheel one Loom and gear with all my
other Household and Kitchen Furniture and Plantation Utensils To
have and to hold to the only proper use and behoof of him the said
John Marks his heirs or assigns forever and I the said Rich^d Marks
do by these presents for myself my heirs executors &c. Covenant bargain
and sell and promise to warrant and forever defend the title of the above
articles to the said John Marks his heirs and assigns forever against
the claim or claims of any person or persons whatsoever in Witness whereof
I have hereunto set my hand and seal this Twenty seventh day of January
one thousand seven hundred and Ninety
