This Indenture made this 11th day of November in the
Year of our Lord Christ one thousand seven hundred eighty and nine
Between Samuel Slade Jr of the County of Southampton & parish of
Notoway of the one part and Joseph Vick of the County and parish aforesaid
of the other part Witnesseth that the said Samuel Slade Jr for and in
Consideration of the just & full sum of thirty one pound ten shillings
Current Money of Virginia by the said Jos Vick to him in hand paid
before the sealing and Delivery of these presents the receipt whereof the
said Samuel Slade Jr doth hereby acknowledge and charge acquit
and discharge the said Jos Vick his heirs and assigns forever and himself
therewith fully and entirely satisfied Contented and paid him the said
Samuel Slade Jr have granted bargained sold aliened conveyed released
retained delivered and confirmed and by these presents doth grant
bargain sell alien convey release retain deliver and confirm unto the
said Jos Vick and to his heirs and assigns forever all that messuage
tract and parcel of Land Situate lying and being in the County of
Southampton and parish of Notoway aforesaid and being part
of that plantation and Tract of Land whereon Samuel
Laneford now lives containing by estimation and survey
be the same more or less and bounded as follows to wit
beginning at a Sweet Gum in black Creek at the mouth
