 between Joseph Pennice and his wife Anne of the County of Southampton of the one part and John Blunt
 of the County of Southampton of the other part witnesseth that the said
 Joseph Pennice his wife Anne and Edmund Sutton for and in
 Consideration of the sum of three thousand and fifty pounds
 current money of Virginia to them in hand paid by the said
 John Blunt before the sealing and delivery hereof therewith
 whereof they doth hereby acknowledge and themselves there
 with fully contented satisfied and paid hath given granted
 Bargained sold aliened Enfeoffed & confirmed & by these presents
 doth for themselves their heirs executors administrators &
 assigns fully freely and absolutely give grant Bargain sell
 alien enfeoff release convey and fully confirm unto the said
 John Blunt his heirs assigns and assigns for ever one certain
 Tract or parcel of land situate lying and being on the north side
 of Meherrin River in the County of Southampton & bounded
 as followeth to wit Beginning at a white oak a corner tree between
 Henry Smith and William Blunt thence along the S. W. corner
 Blunt's line to an ash in Towells Branch a corner tree between
 the said William Blunt and John Blunt thence along the S. E.
 John Blunt's line to hickory a corner tree between the S. Henry
 John Blunt and Henry Smith thence a long the S. Henry
 Smith's line to the beginning station containing by estimation
 more two hundred and thirty four acres be the same more
 or less which was given to the said Anne Pennice by her
