a certain tract or parcel of land situated lying and being in the County
and state aforesaid and bounded as followeth: ^{Wit} Beginning at a
Soutt tree in my yard and running as followeth to my Garden to
the place known as a Division and gave the said Jacob Darden One
part known by my Family this: the said Garden by a line thence
down the said Garden to the corner thence by a straight line
to a gum in the Branch in my pasture below my dam thence
to the run of the Cedar Swamp down the run of the said Swamp
to the road by Henry Gardners line thence along down the said
road towards Southway to a Bottom or pond known by the
name of the meadow to my corn field thence along the 3 fences
east to a cross fence to an old using path thence along the
path to my swinging Gate thence in at the said Gate up
to my new house thence to the east end of the said House to
the first station the said Tract or parcel of land containing
by estimation and hundred acres more or less To have and to hold
the said tract or parcel of land with all its appurtenances of
what ever kind that unto belonging unto my son Jacob
Darden his heirs ^{or assigns} forever to his own proper
use benefit and behoof freely and clearly acquitted discharged
from me my heirs Executors and administrators forever
