The Court held for the County of Southampton on Thursday the 5<sup>th</sup> day  
of July 1790. This Deed and receipt therein and in witness whereof  
by Arthur Jagger and Sarah his wife parties thereto the Being first  
privately examined at the law Directs and ordered to be recorded

Know all men by these presents that I Joseph Powell of Southampton  
County Virginia having now in my possession sundry Slaves and from  
a full conviction of the impropriety of depriving of my fellow Creatures  
of that Blessing liberty which I do highly esteem I therefore  
do manumit and interely set free from me my heirs Executors &  
Administrators For ever the following Slaves (viz) Jinney to go out  
from me January 1<sup>st</sup> 1791- Lido to go out from me January 1<sup>st</sup>  
1791- Primos to go out 2 1790- Phillis at Dec<sup>r</sup> 1799 Willy January 1<sup>st</sup>  
1804 Alfred January 1<sup>st</sup> 1810 Elzab January 1<sup>st</sup> 1812
