This Indenture Made the eightth day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and eighty seven between Howell Briggs and Susannah his wife of the parish of Netoway in the County of Southampton on the one part and Adam Wolfrom of the parish and County aforesaid on the other part Witness both that the said Howell Briggs and Susannah his wife for and in Consideration of the sum of Twenty two pounds six teen shillings to him in hand paid on before the sealing and Delivery of these presents the receipt whereof they do hereby acknowledge and thereof and every part and parcel thereof do fully acquit and discharge him the said Adam Wolfrom by these presents have given granted bargained sold aliened enfeoffed and confirmed and by these presents do give grant bargain sell alien enfeoffed and confirm unto the said Adam Wolfrom his heirs & assigns for ever in a Certain tract or parcel of land lying and being in the aforesaid parish and County containing seventy six acres and bounded as follows Beginning at a pine in James Bells line standing in Kellogs Branch thence down the run of the Branch one hundred and twenty seven poles to a Spanish Oak a corner of Mary Sear boroughs land thence along her line north sixty degrees west eighty three poles to a small sweet gum a corner of Williams Whiteheads land thence along his line north fifty three degrees west seventeen poles to a white Oak a corner of Moody Colliers land thence along his line north eighty four degrees East twenty seven poles to a Turkey Oak thence north thirty degrees East one hundred and fifty eight poles to a small Gum a corner of Howell Briggs's land thence along a new line by marked Trees each forty degrees East thirty two poles to a pine in James Bells line thence along his line north thirty degrees East thirty five poles to a Turkey
