This Indenture made and done this 5th day of June 1790 Between Patience Newsum of the County of Southampton and state of Virginia of the one part and James Wilkinson of County and state aforesaid of the other part witnesseth that the said Patience Newsum for and in consideration of the said James Wilkinson paying unto her the said Patience Newsum annually at the rate of \$32.10 During her life commencing from the 1st July 1789 also to maintain the said Newsum gently at his own house so long as she may be satisfied there with but provided she should not choose to reside with him the said Wilkinson doth hereby agree to furnish her with such diet and accommodations at her own house as the said George Girdley from Thomas John T Blaw, Thomas Samuels Benjamin Blount or any two of them may think necessary also a negro girl suitable to wait on her in consideration where of the said Patience Newsum doth bargain sell and deliver unto the said James Wilkinson his heirs and assigns for ever the following Slaves namely Tom Sam White Jack Darry, Mark Lude and his child Lean to have and to hold the said Slaves to him and his heirs clear and free from any claim and Dem and whatsoever from her the said Patience Newsum or any other person lawfully Claiming or that
