in the above said Lord Christendom one thousand seven hundred and twenty
between Int. Jeyner and Sally Jeyner his wife of the County of Solis prefect
Wight and Colony of Virginia of the one part and Cordal Rowd of the
County of Southampton and Colony aforesaid of the other part with
in witness that they said Int. Jeyner and Sally his wife for and in con-
sideration of the sum of Ten pounds Ten shillings Current money of Virginia
to them in hand paid before the delivery of these presents the receipt where-
of we hereby acknowledge & for our selves therein to be fully satisfied and
the said Int. Jeyner and Sally his wife have bargained sold delivered and
confirmed & by these presents do for gain well enfeoff and confirm unto the
said Cordal Rowd his heirs and assigns forever a certain Tract
or parcel of land Meisage lying and being in the County &
Colony aforesaid containing by estimation thirty seven acres &
half more or less and bounded as follows Viz. Beginning at a
sweet gum standing in the Cypress Swamp adjoining the
Jeyners line from thence a straight Course to a pine &
Joining Johns Barnes line from thence along the
Barnes line to a hickory arjo in the said Barnes line from
thence a straight Course to a pine in the white oak branch
thence down the said branch to the first station
