and Rebecca his wife of Robert Baum as the children and Cohens of the said John
Willms deceased now this Indenture therefore witnesseth that the said William

current money of Virginia to them in hand paid by the said James Haisty
the receipt whereof they do hereby acknowledging and thereof acquit & discharge

grant bargain sell alien release and confirm unto the said James Haisty a certain
tract or parcel of land containing one hundred and forty six acres more or less
situate lying and being in the County aforesaid on the north side of Black Creek
being the land purchased by the said John Willms of Thomas Lane mentioned
above and bounded as in the said indenture mentioned reference being thirteen
chaines more fully appear and all houses and houses woods trees ways
waters water courses profits commodities hereditaments and appertenances to
the same belonging or in any ways appertaining also the reversion and
reversions & remainder and remainders rents issues and services therefrom
of every part thereof together with all the estate & right title interest
claim or demand of them the said William Willms and Mary his wife
Benjamin Willms & Lucretia his wife and Robert Baum & Rebecca his wife
or either of them given unto the same as any part thereof To have & to hold
the said plantation tract or parcel of land with its appertenances &
every part thereof unto the said James Haisty and to his heirs and assigns
