James Wright and Mary his wife of the County of Southampton and parish of Notaway of the one part and Albridge Jones of the same County and parish aforesaid of the other

June 25th 1799 part witnesseth that the said James Wright and Mary his wife for and in consideration of the just and full sum of Ninety three pounds ten Shillings current alreft money of Virginia to them in hand paid or before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof the said James Wright and Mary his wife their heirs and assigns forever doth hereby acknowledge and thereof acquit and discharge the said Albridge Jones his heirs and assigns forever they the said James Wright & Mary his wife hath granted bargained sold aliened released and confirmed and do by these presents grant bargain sell stover and deliver unto him the said Albridge Jones his heirs and assigns forever two certain tracts of plantation and parcels of land adjoining each other and on one of which the said James Wright now lives the first mentioned tract containing by estimation one hundred and twenty acres be the same more or less situated lying and being in the aforesaid County of Southampton and parish of Notaway and bounded as follows to wit beginning at a red oak on the north side of a branch a corner of the land belonging to the orphans of David Wright deceased thence running the said branch south thirty one degrees east fifty six poles to a red oak thence south south west seventy two pole a red oak a line tree of Jeffery wood thence along a line of man head trees west by north one hundred and sixty eight poles to a white oak a corner of William Williams land thence by Wiliams land north sixty three poles to a pine north forty eight degrees west six poles to a red oak a corner of William Jones land thence by the said Joneses land north twenty five degrees east fifty nine pole to a pine by the side of the turning branch thence down the various courses of the run of the said branch to the branch begun ^{upon} and thence up the various courses of the said branch to the beginning and the other mentioned tract containing by estimation seventeen acres be the same more or less and bounded as follows to wit beginning at a pine a corner of Jefferys line by the side of Anthony's branch thence by the said Bayours line north sixty three degrees west forty pole to a red oak a line tree of the first mentioned tract thence along the said line south east ten degrees
