

178 This Indenture made this 11th day of July, in the year of our Lord one
Thousand seven hundred and eighty nine, between Laurence Jeyner of the County
of Southampton and Parish of Notoway, of the one part and Absolom Jeyner of
the County, and Parish aforesaid of the other part whereas the said Absolom
Jeyner did at the request of the aforesaid Laurence Jeyner become bound with
him in a Bond to Miriam Scott for the sum of eighteen pounds fifteen shilling
and 6^d which said bond is now in the possession of Jordan and Joseph Denmore
which said bond is dated the 15th day of May 1784 and it is but right and reasonable
that the said Absolom Jeyner his heirs and assigns should be saved harmless
from damage and recede in the aforesaid sum Now this Indenture witnesseth
that for indemnifying saving harmless and securing the said Absolom Jeyner
from all trouble costs damage or loss whatsoever to him or to his heirs or assigns
shall or may hereafter arise by means or reason of the said Absolom Jeyner
becoming security of the said Laurence Jeyner as aforesaid and also for and
in consideration of the just and full sum of ^{one} ~~five~~ shillings Current money of Virginia
by the said Absolom Jeyner to the said Laurence Jeyner in hand paid before the
sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof the said Laurence
Jeyner doth hereby acknowledge and thereof acquit and discharge the said
Absolom Jeyner and himself therewith fully and entirely satisfied Contented
and paid he the said Laurence Jeyner hath granted bargained sold aliened
infeoffed released release delivered and confirmed and by these presents doth
grant bargain sell aliened infeoffed release release and confirm unto the said
Absolom Jeyner and to his heirs and assigns forever all that Plantation-
messuage tract and parcel of land whereon the said Laurence Jeyner now
liveth situated lying and being in the County of Southampton and Parish
of Notoway aforesaid on or near Black Creek swamp containing by
estimation three hundred and fifty acres of land be the same more or
less and bounded according to the known and reputed bounds thereof and
all the houses out houses edifices buildings Orchards woods ways watercourses
hereditaments and appurtenances whatsoever to the same belonging or in
anywise appertaining and the reversion and reversions remainder and remain-
ments issues and profits thereof and all the estate right title interest claim
or demand of them the said Laurence Jeyner his heirs and assigns to the same any part and
parcel thereof To have and to hold the said plantation messuage tract
and parcel of three hundred and fifty acres of land and premises with
the appurtenances as aforesaid unto them the said Absolom Jeyner
