This Indenture made this first day of April in the said year 1790
one thousand seven hundred and ninety, and betwixt Thomas Clements Jr of the
County of Southampton and Parish of Netoway, of the one part and Hartwell
Coke of the County and parish aforesaid of the other part Whereas the said
Thomas Clements stands justly indebted to the said Hartwell Coke the
sum of Sixty pounds eighteen Shillings and five pence half penny on bonds of
the above date and is desirous that no harm shall accrue to the said Hartwell
Coke in consequence thereof Now this Indenture witnesseth that as the
said Thomas Clements is willing and desirous of discharging the aforesaid
debt with all lawful Interest thereon and Costs doth hereby for and in con-
sideration of the sum of Five Shillings in hand paid the receipt whereof
he doth hereby acknowledge before the sealing and delivery of these
presents and both acquit and discharge the said Hartwell Coke his heirs &
assigns for ever to the said Thomas Clements hath granted bargained sold
and delivered unto the said Hartwell Coke and his heirs for ever one negro
fello named Cain also One Yoke of Oxen for and in consideration of the
above debt of sixty pounds eighteen shillings and five pence half
penny to have and to hold the aforesaid negro Cain and Yoke of Oxen
to him and his heirs for ever in special Trust and Confidence now thence
to make sale of the said negro Cain and Yoke of Oxen for the best price
he can and apply the money arising from the sale thereof to the discharge
of the aforesaid debt to the or in plus if any to be paid to the said
Thomas Clements his heirs or assigns and the said Thomas
