This Indenture made this Twelfth day of Decr in the year of our
 Lord Christ one thousand seven hundred and Eighty nine Between Drury
 Harris and Priscilla his wife of the County of Southampton of the one
 part and Lewis Harris of the said County of the other part witnesseth
 that the said Drury Harris and Priscilla his wife for and in Consider-
 ration of the sum of fifty one Pounds five shillings Current money
 of Virginia to him in hand paid by the said Lewis Harris the receipt
 thereof the said Drury Harris doth hereby acknowledge to be fully
 satisfied and paid hath bargained sold aliened released and confirmed &
 doth by these presents fully and absolutely grant sell and confirm
 unto the said Lewis Harris his heirs and assigns forever one certain
 tract or parcel of land containing by late survey one hundred two &
 half acres be the same more or less lying in the County of Southam-
 pton aforesaid and in the fork of the flat Swamp and bounded
 as followeth Beginning at a black gum on the run of the run of the
 south prong or branch of the said flat swamp thence down the run
 of the said branch or prong aforesaid one hundred and fifty four
 poles to the fork of the said swamp thence up the run of the north
 prong or branch of the said flat swamp one hundred & eighty
 six poles to the corner on the said run thence South sixty
 degrees west one hundred and seventy seven poles to a red oak
 corner on Joseph Harris's line thence south fifteen degrees west
 thirty nine poles to the Beginning To have and to hold the 3.
 One hundred and two and half acres of land together with all the
 appurtenances thereunto belonging or in any wise appertaining
 and all its privileges to the only proper use of him the said Lewis
 Harris his heirs and assigns forever free from the Lett hindrance &
