 of the Borough of Norfolk & Elizabeth his wife of the one part and
 William Brown surviving and only acting executor of the last will and Testament
 of William Brown late of the County of Surrey deceased of the other
 part Whereas the said William Brown deceased in his life time purchased of
 and from the aforesaid Henry Brown party hereto the fee simple estate
 of and in and certain tract or parcel of land situate lying and being in the
 County of Southampton both sides of Grand Vile and the Surber swampes
 containing by estimation eleven hundred and ninety four acres more or
 less for the consideration of one thousand pounds in consequence of
 which agreement the said William Brown entered upon and was in
 the actual possession of the said lands and premises but before
 any legal conveyance was executed by the said Henry Brown the
 said William Brown departed this life having first made his last
 will and Testament and a Council thereto annexed which last
