 eighty one out of the said Will and Codicil appointed several executors  
 the said William Browne hereby doth duly proved the same in the court of the  
 County of Sarum and took upon himself the burthen of the execution thereof in  
 said Codicil is the following clause I have purchased from Henry Browne one  
 plantation and tract of land in Southampton County but having got no conveyance  
 to the same I now direct that the purchase be completed with and that conveyance  
 be made by the said Henry Browne to my son Benjamin Browne of the  
 minor plantation and three hundred acres of land adjoining part thereof  
 to wit the remaining lands I direct may be conveyed to my executor and that they  
 shall the same in such parcels as they shall think proper and among the  
 residue and remainder agreeably to my Will, as by the said will and  
 Codicil relation being thereto had may more at large appear And whereas the  
 said Henry Browne by one certain indenture bearing date the eleventh  
 day of January one thousand seven hundred and eighty eight in confirmation  
 of the agreement herein before mentioned hath conveyed unto the heirs or  
 representatives of Benjamin Browne deceased the manor plantation with three  
 hundred acres of land adjoining as by the said will and Codicil aforesaid. he is  
 to do And this indenture therefore witnesseth that in further confirmation  
 of the agreement aforesaid in full compliance with the will & Codicil before said  
 and also for and in consideration of the payment and securing the aforesaid sum  
 five thousand pounds to the said Henry Browne by the executors of the said  
 William Browne deceased The receipt whereof he doth hereby acknowledge  
 they the said Henry Browne and Elizabeth his wife have and by these  
 presents do and each of them doth grant bargain sell alien release and  
 confirm unto the said William Browne executor of the said William Browne  
 All that tract or parcel of land situate in the County of Southampton on the  
 east side of Parson Hill and the Horse Pen Swamps being the residue and  
 remainder of the lands as aforesaid purchased by the said William  
 Browne deceased of the said Henry Browne and adjoining the three  
 hundred acres with the manor plantation as is above recited to be  
 conveyed by the said Henry Browne to the representatives of Benjamin  
 Browne deceased containing by estimation eight hundred and ninety  
 five acres both the same more or less and bounded as the same was held  
 and occupied by the said Henry Browne and those under whom he  
 claimed to have and to hold the said tract or parcel of land and premises  
 with the appurtenances unto the said William Browne as executor  
 of the last will and testament and Codicil of the said William  
 Browne deceased and for the purposes therein mentioned
