This Indenture made this 16 day of March 1791
Between James Wilkinson of the County of Southampton of the one
part and Benjamin Gray of the said County of the other do hereby
that the said James Wilkinson for and in consideration of the sum
of seventy pounds the receipt whereof the said Wilkinson doth
acknowledge hath bargain sold and delivered and by these presents
doth bargain sell and deliver unto the said Benj. Gray his heirs &c.
a Certain Tract or parcel of land lying in the County of Southampton
containing by estimation one hundred and 1/4 of acres more or less
as followeth Beginning at a corner pine running S. 15 E. 140 poles
then N. 79 E. 41 poles thence S. 80 poles to the S. Gray line then
N. 92 poles to a corner white Oak on the side of Powell's branch
thence up the various courses of the said Branch N. 80. W. 17 poles
then N. 66. W. 90 poles thence N. 82 W. 60 poles to the fork station (it
being part of the tract whereon the said Wilkinson now liveth)
To have and to hold the said land with the appurtenances
thereunto belonging to the only proper use and behoof of the said
Gray his heirs and assigns for ever and the said Wilkinson for
himself his heirs assigns for ever doth for ever warrant and hold
