Jayner and Henry Jones for and in consideration of the just and full sum of  
Fifteen pounds to him in hand paid by the said Joseph Denson the receipt  
whereof the said Giles Jayner and Margaret his wife William Jayner and  
Mary his wife Louisa Jayner and Henry Jones doth hereby acknowledge have  
had indebt of them hath and by these presents doth each of them doth  
grant Bargain sell alien release and confirm unto the said Joseph Denson  
and to his heirs and assigns forever all that plantation of改善地  
of Land and premises which cheappertainances situate lying and being in the  
County of Southampton and parish of Talloway aforesaid at present in the  
Tenure and occupation of Joseph Mountforth containing by estimation
