 Mary his wife Lewis Joynes and Henry Jones do hereby acknowledge have
 have and each of them hath and by these presents do and each of them doth
 grant bargain sell alien release and confirm unto the said Joseph Denson
 and to his heirs and assigns forever all that plantation coppage tract or parcel
 of Land and premises with the appurtenances situate lying and being in the
 County of Southampton and parish of Antway aforesaid at present in the
 Tenure and occupation of Joseph Denson containing by estimation
 two hundred and twenty two acres be the same more or less and
