other person or persons whatsoever the said tract or parcel of land with all and singular  
the premises with its appurtenances unto the said Benjamin Barham his heirs and

one thousand seven hundred and ninety one between Edwin Sommons and Rebekah his wife of the  
County of Southampton and parish of Nottonway of the one part and Drury Williams of the same  
county and parish of the other part witnesseth that the said Edwin Sommons and Rebekah  
his wife for and in consideration of the just and full sum of fifty one pounds current money  
of Virginia by the said Drury Williams to them in hand paid before the sealing & delivery  
of these presents the receipt whereof the said Edwin Sommons and Rebekah his wife  
doth hereby acknowledge and thereof acquit and discharge the said Drury Williams  
his heirs and assigns forever and themselves therewith fully and entirely satisfied  
Contented and pased they the said Edwin Sommons and Rebekah his wife  
have granted bargained sold aliened enfeoffed released set over delivered and  
confirmed and by these presents doth grant bargain sell alien enfeoff release  
set over deliver and confirm unto the said Drury Williams and to his  
heirs and assigns forever all that plantation messuge tract and parcel of  
land wherein Peter Denson now lives situate lying and being in  
the County of Southampton and parish of Nottonway afores
