Benjamin Blunt Just^t Gentlemen Justices of the peace for the County of South-
ampton greeting whereas Benjamin Ivy and Sally his wife of the County of
Randolph state of North Carolina have by their certain indenture of Bargain
and Sale dated the nineteenth day of January in the Year of our Lord one
thousand seven hundred and ninety sold and conveyed unto Phillips Ivy
of the county of Southampton the fee simple estate of and in one certain tract
or parcel of land containing one hundred and seventy five acres be the same
more or less and bounded as is expressed in the said indenture situated
lying and being in the aforesaid county of Southampton and whereas the
said Sally Ivy cannot conveniently travel to an court of our said County
of Southampton to make acknowledgement of the same, wherefore
Command you or any two or more of you that you go personally to her
Sally Ivy and examine her privately and apart from her said husband who
then she has executed the said deed freely and voluntarily without the persuasion
or threats of her said husband and whether she is willing that the said
indenture should be recorded in the Court of our said County of Southampton
and when you have examined her as aforesaid and taken her acknowledg-
ment of the said indenture that you distinctly and plainly certify us
thereof under your hands and Seals returning to us also this writing
with the said indenture annexed witness Samuel H. Clark
for said Court at his office the 23rd day of November 1791 and in
