This Indenture made this 21th day of November in the
 Year of our Lord Christ one thousand seven hundred and ninety one
 Between Henry Kennel of the County of Southampton and parish of St.
 Lukes of the one part and Samuel Francis of the other and of the County
 and parish aforesaid witnesseth that the said Henry Kennel for and in
 the consideration of the sum of one hundred and ninety three pounds sixteen
 shillings current money of Virginia to him in hand paid once before
 the signing and delivering of these presents the receipt whereof the
 Henry Kennel doth hereby acknowledge hath granted bargained
 and sold aliened and confirmed unto the said Samuel Francis and to his
 heirs and assigns forever one certain tract or parcel of land situate lying
 and being in the said County in the parish of St. Lukes lying and
 bounded as followeth to wit. Beginning at an ash in Crosswamp
 South 5 degrees West 56 poles to gum South 41 degrees West 36 poles
 to white oaks a corner of Wm Vaughan then south 69. East 106
 poles up the pasturage branch then South 69. East 106 poles
 then South 23 degrees East 164 poles then South 40 degrees East 50 poles to a
 pine a corner of Henry Turners then South 69 degrees East 106 poles to a
 red Oak a corner of John Powell then North 26. East 10 poles
 to a red Oak a corner then North 26 degrees East 13 poles to a
