This Indenture made this ninth day of February in the year of our Lord one
thousand seven hundred and Ninety two Between Edward Harris of the County of
Southampton of the one part and James Harris of the said County of the other part —
Witnesseth That the said Edward Harris for and in Consideration of the sum of one
hundred and five pounds ten shillings Current Money of Virginia to him in hand paid by
the said James Harris the receipt whereof the said Edward Harris doth hereby acknowl-
edge he the said Edward Harris hath granted bargained and sold and by these presents
doth grant bargain sell alien and conform unto the said James Harris his heirs
and assigns forever all that Tract or parcel of land situate lying and being in the said
County of Southampton and is bounded as follows, to wit, Beginning at a small white oak
a corner of Lewis Thorpe's Land (which was formerly the land of Richard Bland) by the
side of the three Creek Thence by the said Thorpe's line south twenty degrees west nineteen
pole ten a.m. and south fifty five degrees west sixty two pole to a corner a corner
in the said Thorpe's line, thence by the said Thorpe's line south sixty degrees west
one hundred and fifteen poles to a Red oak thence south east ninety five poles
to a pine, south east Eighty five poles to a pine in a meadow and one
hundred and thirty poles to a black oak by the side of a small branch
northeast by north forty five pole to a hickory a corner of the
aforesaid James Harris's land formerly James Atkins's thence
by the said James Harris's line north ten degrees east twenty eight
poles to a pine and the same continues fifty eight poles to a
