 1792 This Indenture was acknowledged by Brittain Britt the
 acting Sec^y of John Britt dead and ordered to be recorded as

This Indenture made this ninth day of February in the year of
 our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety two Between William Ingram
 and Ann his wife of the county of Southampton and parish of Nettonway of the
 one part and John Smith of the County and parish aforesaid of the other part
 witnesseth that the said William Ingram and Ann his wife for and in
 consideration of the just and full sum of fifty five pounds current money
 of Virginia by the said John Smith to them in hand paid the receipt whereof
 the said William Ingram and Ann his wife doth hereby acknowledge
 and thereof acquit and discharge the said John Smith his heirs and assigns
 forever and them selves therewith fully and intirely satisfied Contented
 and paid they the said William Ingram and Ann his wife have granted
 bargained sold aliened enfeoffed released set over delivered and confirmed and by
 these presents doth grant bargain sell a lien enfeoff release set over deliver
 and confirm unto the said John Smith and to his heirs and assigns forever
 all that plantation messuage tract and parcel of land whereon the said Wm
 Ingram now lives situate lying and being in the County of Southampton and
 Parish of Nettonway aforesaid including all the lands which the said
 William Ingram bought of Richard Tatum by indenture bearing date October
 1777 also all the lands which the said William Ingram purchased of
 Arthur Joiner by indenture bearing date the 1st day of October 1786
 also all the lands which the said William Ingram bought of
 Lewis Joiner by Indenture bearing date the 10th day of June 1790
 the whole containing by estimation ninety five acres be the same more or less bounded
 and described as by the aforesaid dees are severally and distinctly expressed
 and declared, and all the houses out houses edifices buildings woods waigwaters
 and water courses profits commodities hereditaments and appurtenances
 whatsoever to the same belonging or in any wise appertaining and the
 reversions and reversions remainder and remainders rents issues and
 profits thereof and all the estate right title interest claim or demand of
 them the said William Ingram and Ann his wife of in and to the
 same and every part and parcel thereof to have and to hold
 the said plantation messuage tracts and parcels of
