

Southampton County adjoining Henry Harrison's land and bounded as follows
 Beginning at a peg more near the upper end of Sturgeon's riding house south
 54 West 75 pole to the head of the mill branch then down the said branch
 to 2 degrees East 23 pole then to 8 degrees East 6 pole to the gum swamp, thence down
 the said gum swamp along Anthony Parsons line until it comes opposite
 to a marked poplar thence to said poplar then north 70 Degrees east 34 pole
 to a maple in the mill branch then north 16 D. West 60 pole then north
 15 D. East 20 pole then north 34 pole then north 30 D. West 15 pole to the
 Beginning To have and to hold the aforesaid tract of land containing
 thirty five acres more or less with the appertinances unto the said Henry
 Harrison, his heirs and assigns for ever the said John Sturgeon doth
 for himself and his heirs covenant and grant to and with the said
 Henry Harrison in manner and form following that he the said
 Sturgeon hath good right full power and lawfull authority to grant
 and convey the said premises above mentioned unto said Henry Harrison
 shall and may at all times hereafter peaceably and quietly have hold
 use and enjoy the above Land without the least out trouble or
 charge whatsoever of or by the said John Sturgeon his heirs or
 assigns or any other person or persons whatsoever lawfully having
 any or claiming any right title or interest to the said above
 mentioned Land or any part thereof and the said John Sturgeon
 and his heirs the land doth hereby warrant and the title forever
 defend against him self his heirs and assigns against all and every other
 person claiming or pretending to claim any right or title to
