To all persons to whom this writing shall come greeting know ye, that I Edmund Turner of the County of Southampton for and in Consideration of divers Motives and inducements me hereunto especially moving, have thought fit and do by these presents manumit and set free a certain negro man Slave called and known by the name of Simon, to whom I hereby relinquish all claim right title, authority and demand whatsoever and do (for his money) bind myself, my heirs executors, and administrators, the said Simon, from all personal service in future, for ever to release — In Witness whereof I have here unto set my hand and Seal this ^{thirteenth} day of June anno domini one thousand seven hundred and ninety two Signed Sealed and Delivered in presence of —

This Indenture made this thirteenth day of April in the year of our Lord Christ one thousand seven hundred and ninety two Between Isaac Johnson and Arthur Turner and Harris Johnson of the County of Southampton and state of Virginia of the one part and Joshua Johnson of the County and state aforesaid of the other Part witnesseth that the said Isaac Johnson and Arthur Turner and Harris Johnson for and in consideration of the sum of Five Dollars Current Money of Virginia to them in hand paid by the said Joshua Johnson the receipt whereof they the said Isaac Johnson and Arthur Turner and Harris Johnson doth hereby acknowledge they the said Isaac Johnson and Arthur Turner and Harris Johnson have granted bargained and sold
