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To all to whom these presents shall come be it knowned that
whereas George Briggs deceased; late of the County of Sussex
and Benjamin Blunt of the County of Southampton had an equal
right between them in five Negroes all Children of a Negro woman
named Lucy, to wit. Billy, Joan, Easter, Titus and Rose, and the said
George Briggs died did by his last Will devise and give one of the
said Negro Children named Joan to his Daughter Mary Blunt now dead,
then wife to John Thomas Blunt of the S. County of Southampton and
did further give and devise all the rest of S. Negro Children to
the aforesaid Benjamin Blunt; and the said Benjamin Blunt
believing and being fully satisfied that it was the will and desire
of the said George Briggs that his said Daughter Mary Blunt now
dead should have and possess the whole of the said Negro Girl Joan
now for the purpose of carrying the will of the said George
Briggs died into full effect; at least so far as it respects the said
Negro Children, the said Benjamin Blunt doth give grant all
his right and title in the said Negro Girl Joan unto the aforesaid
John T. Blunt and to his heirs forever and the said Benjamin Blunt
doth for himself his heirs executors or assigns acknowledge that
he is fully satisfied for vodoing without any fee or reward except that
of complying with the desire and intention of the said George Briggs died
for Witness whereof the said Benjamin Blunt hath hereunto
set his hand and affixed his Seal this first day of Jan^y 1792
