hath this day made a purchase of five Negroes Slaves namely
Patt. Comfort. Cherry, Milley and Walker, the property
of Edward Harris now known all by these presents that I
Edward Harris for and in consideration of the sum of Nineteen
pounds seven shillings ten pence to me in hand paid by the
Thomas Turner the receipt whereof I do hereby acknowledge have
bargained sold delivered and by these presents do absolutely
bargain sell and deliver unto the said Thomas Turner the
aforesaid Negroes Slaves named Patt. Comfort, Cherry,
Milley and Walker to have and to hold the said five
Negroes Slaves to him the said Tho: Turner his heirs and
administrators or assigns forever and I the said
Edward Harris for my self and my heirs executors &
administrators do covenant and agree the aforesaid five
Negroes Slaves unto the said Thomas Turner his heirs
executors administrators and assigns against the lawful
claim and demands of all persons whatsoever to warrant
and forever defend by these presents in its full
whereof the said Edward Harris his hand and seal
have hereunto subscribed and set this 11th day
of April in the Year of our Lord Christ
