This Indenture made this 13th day of September in the year of our lord Christ one thousand seven hundred and ninety one between Benjamin Blake & Pissilla Blake his wife of the county of Southampton and parish of St. Lukes of the one part, and Edwin Claud of the aforesaid county and parish of the other part Witnesseth that the said Benjamin Blake and Pissilla his wife for and in the consideration of the sum of Eight pounds current money of Virginia to them in hand paid on or before the sealing & delivering of these presents, the receipt whereof we the said Benj^m Blake and Pissilla doth hereby acknowledge, hath granted bargained and sold aliened and confirmed unto the said Edwin Claud & to his heirs and assigns forever one certain tract or parcel of Land, situate lying and being in the said county (in the parish of St. Lukes) lying on the south side of the three creeks & on the south side of the angelico swamp and bounded as followeth to wit. Beginning at a oak stump near the house where Thomas Blake Junr lived formerly North 58 degrees eighteen pole to a white oak thence south 44 degrees West eighteen pole
