This Indenture more entire unto & concluded between William Broune of Surrey county & Benjamin Drew of Southampton County witnesses: that the s^r William Broune for & in consideration of the sum of one hundred and eighty pounds to him in hand paid (the receipt whereof he the s^r William Broune doth hereby acknowledge) he the s^r Broune hath bargained granted, sold aliened, confirmed released & made over & by these presents doth bargain grant sell alien confirm release and make over unto the s^r Ben^g Drew one certain tract or parcel of land lying and situate and being in the county of Southampton & parish of Stotaway containing by estimation five hundred acres be the same more or less & bounded as follows viz. on the North side of Arthur Caum's line on the east side by Col^l Samuel Keels line & Robert Caum's line on the south by Melchizedech Pimans line & John H. Ponas line & Richard Ponas line & on the west by the plantation whereon Th^o Gray now
