Whereas John Harris of Southampton county hath this day 1725 made a purchase of four Negroes Slaves namely Larkin Kelly, Phoebe Milbra the property of Edward Harris now known all by these presents that I Edward Harris for & in consideration of the sum of nineteen pounds seven shillings & ten pence to me in hand paid by the s^d John Harris the receipt whereof I do hereby acknowledge have bargained sold delivered & by these presents do absolutely bargain sell & deliver unto the s^d John Harris the aforesaid Negro Slaves named Larkin Kelly Phoebe Milbra To have & to hold the s^d four Negro slaves to him the s^d John Harris his heirs execs. admors. & assigns forever & I the s^d Edward Harris for my self & my heirs execs. & assigns do covenant and agree the aforesaid four negro slaves unto the s^d John Harris his heirs execs. admors. and assigns against the lawful claim & demand of all persons whatsoever to warrant & forever defend by these presents in witness whereof the s^d Edward Harris his hand and seal have hereunto subscribed & set this ninth day of April in the year of our lord Christ one thousand seven hundred and
