Know all men by these presents that I William Keelson of Southampton county for an in consideration of twenty pounds to me in hand paid by Charles Taylor free in behalf of myself my heirs executors &c. bargained sold transferred made over & delivered unto the s^d Charles Taylor his heirs executors &c. one Negro man by name of Maulborough for a more free perfect description the Negro Maulborough I William Keelson sold unto Jesse Brown and afterwards by the consent of Jesse Brown William Keelson had the use of the negro during his natural life which use and severally now I in behalf of myself my heirs executors administrators or assigns have for the above mentioned sum bargained sold and delivered unto Charles Taylor to him his heirs executors administrators or assigns for ever free from all claim or claims whatsoever & likewise I give all my right or claim or claims whatsoever unto —
