sold & delivered & by these presents doth bargain sell alien enfeoff & confirm
unto the s^r Cook a certain tract of land lying on the ne side of Tannaw
creek in the county aforesaid containing by estimation three hundred
acres be the same more or less & bounded as followeth with begining at
the mouth of the swel house swamp thence up the various courses of the
run of the s^r swamp to a poppan gum thence to a hickory standing
on the high land in Benjamin Grays line thence along a line of
marked trees to a lightwood stump a corner of the s^r Grays line
from thence to a hickory another corner from thence a straight line
to an oak on the side of the main road from thence to a white
oak in John Kindreds line thence along the s^r Kindreds line to
an ad corner of Cordall Bynum's line thence to the run of the
little swamp thence down the various courses of the run of the s^r
swamp to Tannaw creek thence down the various courses of the
creek to the begining To have & to hold the s^r tract of land and
premises with all the appertenances therunto belonging unto the s^r
Lazarus Cook & to his heirs forever and the s^r James Willison
for himself his heirs &c doth forever warrant and defend the title of the
same against all and every person or persons whatsoever in witness
whereof the s^r Willison doth hereunto set his hand & affix his seal
