This Indenture made this fourteenth day of February in the year of our Lord Christ one thousand seven hundred & ninety three between Jacob Barnes of the county of Southampton of the one part and William Barnes his son of the county afores^e of the other part witnesseth that the s^c Jacob Barnes for & in consideration of the sum of five pounds current money of Virginia to the s^c Jacob Barnes in hand paid by the said William Barnes the receipt whereof the s^c Jacob Barnes do hereby acknowledge that he the s^c Jacob Barnes have granted Bargained & sold aliened & confirmed & by these presents do grant bargain & sell alien & confirm unto the s^c William Barnes his heirs & assigns forever one neat tract or parcel of land situate lying & being on the south side of No. town river in the county of Southampton afores^e containing by supposition three hundred & seven acres be the same more or less & bounded as follows. — Beginning at a pine standing on the north side of the west prong of the buck horn swamp against the mouth of the stockhouse branch thence across the swamp to a white oak standing in the branch thence up the various courses of the branch to a black gum at the fork of the branch thence up the various courses of the south east prong of the branch to a sweet gum in the N. E. of the s^c prong thence to a pine post standing at the east end of the branch thence to a turkey oak standing below the plum orchard thence to a white oak standing on the south side of the pond branch thence to a maple standing in the long branch thence to a black gum thence to a small turkey oak thence to a red oak thence to a persimmon tree from thence to a white oak standing on the north side of the buck horn swamp a corner tree between Nathan Foster & Benjamin Johnson thence down the various courses of the buck horn swamp to a white oak a corner tree on the North edge of the low ground of the buck horn swamp thence by a line of marked trees across to the west prong of the buck horn swamp thence across the swamp to a willow oak corner tree between the tract of land that Alice Munn
