to account with the execs. of Lydia Casper for the other fourth part More the  
Indenture witnesseth that the s<sup>d</sup> William Thomas Jun<sup>r</sup> T Blown Jun<sup>r</sup> Benj<sup>m</sup> Edwards  
& Richard Blown commissioners as afores<sup>d</sup> for & in consideration of the sum of Forty  
pounds one shilling current money of W<sup>g</sup> to be paid by the s<sup>d</sup> John Rockell pursuant  
to the s<sup>d</sup> order, deces to the above named legates of Lydia Casper or their legal representatives  
& to the execs. of the s<sup>d</sup> Lydia have bargained sold aliened & confirmed by these presents  
do bargain sell alien & confirm to the s<sup>d</sup> John Rockell to him & his heirs forever the  
said tract or parcel of land lying in the s<sup>d</sup> County of Southampton & bounded as follows  
(to wit) Beginning at a live oak on the north side of Dicks swamp thence north forty  
degrees west one hundred & one pole to a pine thence west by south one hundred & twenty  
six pole to a whit oak thence south west by west sixty two pole to a small Gum by the  
side of the afores<sup>d</sup> Dicks swamp & down the various courses of the run of the s<sup>d</sup> swamp to  
the beginning containing one hundred acres more or less together with all the profits  
privileges & appurtenances whatsoever to the s<sup>d</sup> premises belonging or in any wise appertain-  
ing To have and to hold the afores<sup>d</sup> tract or parcel of land with the appurtenances  
as afores<sup>d</sup> unto the s<sup>d</sup> John Rockell & his heirs forever & the s<sup>d</sup> W<sup>m</sup> Thomas Jun<sup>r</sup> T Blown Jun<sup>r</sup>

part thereof against themselves & against every other person or persons claiming under them
