This Indenture made this 26th day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred & ninety three Between Thomas Holladay of the county of Southampton State of Virg^a of the one part & William Bittle of the County State afores^d of the other part witnesseth that the s^d Tho^s Holladay for & in consideration of the sum of nine pounds eleven shillings & six pence Current Money of Virg^a to him in hand p^d by the said William Bittle the receipt whereof I do hereby acknowledge that the s^d Tho^s Holladay have bargained & sold aliened & confirmed & by these presents do grant bargain sell alien & confirm unto the s^d William Bittle his heirs & assigns forever one neat tract or parcel of land situate lying & being on the south side of Wittingness river in the County of Southampton afores^d containing Twelve & three quarters acres be the same more or less & bounded as follows Vizt. Beginning at a black Oak a corner of his old line thence along his line N. 65° E. 100 poles to a red oak thence N. 50° E. 22½ poles to a pine thence along a line of marked trees N. 69 W. 22 poles to a pine thence N. 72 W. 21 poles to a small black oak thence N. 67 W. 26 poles to a pine thence N. 61 W. 16½ pole to a black gum thence N. 58 W. 40 poles to a pine thence S. 3 W. 7½
