The commonwealth of Virginia to John Simmons, William Bines and William Edmunds  
greeting: Whereas Edwin Gray and Juliana his wife have by their certain indentures of bargain and  
sale dated the 8<sup>th</sup> day of August 1786 conveyed the fee simple estate of land in one certain tract or parcel  
of land containing two hundred and ninety five acres of land to Jesse barrell and whereas the said  
Juliana sumeth conveniently travel to the court of our said county to relinquish her right of dower in the  
same as the law directs. These are therefore to command you or any two or more of you personally to go  
to the said Juliana and examine her privately and apart from her said husband, whether she hath  
assented the deed herewith annexed without the persuasion or threats of her said husband, and  
whether she is willing that the same should be recorded in the court of our said county of South-  
ampton and when you have examined her as aforesaid that you distinctly and plainly certify us  
thereunder your hands and seals returning to us also this writ annexed to the said indentures  
Witness Samuel Wells clerk of our said court at the courthouse the 2<sup>nd</sup> day of January 1787 in the  
11<sup>th</sup> year of the commonwealth.
