This Indenture of two parts made this the 12th day of September in the year four and sixty
one thousand seven hundred Ninety three Between Sampson Pitman of the one part & Philip Pitman
of the other part both of Southampton County & Nettoway parish Witnesseth that the S^r Sampson
Pitman for and in consideration of the sum of five Shillings to him in hand paid before the making
& delivery of these presents by the said Philip Pitman the receipt whereof the S^r Sampson Pitman
doth hereby acknowledge & confess as well for & in consideration of the Natural Law & Affection
of him the said Sampson to the said Philip Pitman hath granted bargain & aliened a piece
conformable & sole By these presents doth bargain grant alien confirm & sell unto the said
Philip Pitman his heirs and assigns all that tract or parcel of Land lying & being in the
county of Southampton & parish of Nettoway containing by estimation One hundred fifty Acres
or thereabouts more or less known by the most usual & reputed boundaries thereof by the name of Clungers
place & particularly being bounded as follow Viz bounded by a line dividing the said tract from
the land of Charles Pitman the said line beginning from the mouth of the Meadew branch
up to the ten rough places along line of marked trees to Charles Bonds line on Sarahs branch
and then by the line of the said tract to the beginning
