

I, *Isiah Cather* of the County of Southampton Virginia being fully persuaded that freedom is the
 natural right of all man kind & that it is my duty to do unto others as I would desire to be done by in the
 like situation, and having under my care these Negroes whom I have heretofore held as Slaves of the
 following names & ages (Viz) Will about forty five years Sarah about Twenty & Pleasant abt 18 years
 I hereby Emancipate out free all and every the above named Slaves And do for myself my heirs
 Executors and administrators relinquish all my right title Interest & claim or pretensions of
 claim whatsoever either to these persons or any estate they may hereafter acquire
 And having also two now in their minority (Viz) Phoebe 15 Pate 11 years each of which I
 also hereby Emancipate & set free. Not believing it right for me to act as Guardian over them
 untill they arrive to the age of 18 years. And I do for myself my heirs & Executors relin-
 quish all my right title Interest & claim or pretensions of claim whatsoever either to these
 persons or any estate they may acquire after they shall attain to the ages above which
 will be at the following times. *Phoebe* 1st 8th Month 1795 *Pate* 1st 2nd Month 1799 All
 the above Negroes & their Posterity to enjoy their full freedom without any interruption
 from me or any person claiming for by or under me In Witness whereof I have hereunto
 set my hand & seal this 2nd day of February 1793.

This Indenture made this 26th day of January in the year four Last Christ 1793
 Between Thomas Halladay & his wife Mary of the County of Port State of Virg^a of the one
 part & Thomas Turner of the County & State afores^d of the other part Witnesseth that the said
 Thomas Halladay his wife Mary for & in consideration of the sum of Thirty eight Pounds Eleven
 Shillings Current money of Virg^a to him in hand paid by the said Thomas Turner the receipt
 whereof the said Thomas Halladay & his wife Mary doth hereby acknowledge they the said
 Thomas Halladay & his wife Mary have granted bargained & sold aliened & confirmed by
 Valuable power one feat tract or parcel of Land Situate lying & being on the south side
 of following River in the County of Southampton afores^d containing 66 1/2 Acres both the same
 more or less & as follows (Viz) Beginning at a small Maple in Townsend Branch
 thence along his old line N. 12 East degrees East 83 Poles to a pine a corner in the
 Ridley's line Thence along the said line N. 62 degrees East 65 Poles to a black oak
 a corner tree of the Fighugh Thence along the said Fighugh's line South 46 degrees
 East 23 Poles to a black Oak Thence South 77 degrees East 77 Poles to a pine a corner in the
 Fighugh's line Thence along a line of meadow trees South 52 degrees West 38 Poles
 to a white oak in the side of a small branch Thence
