 Branch thence up the said branch to a gum a corner of Moses Booth's land line thence West
 along the said Moses Booth's line to the main run of the Lightwood Swamp a piece thence
 down the various courses of the run of the s^d swamp to the beginning And all profits common
 hereditaments and appurtenances whatsoever to the s^d tract or parcel of land belonging in
 anywise appertaining and the reversion reversion remainder & remainders unto James
 and profits thereof and all the Estate right title interest use trust possession property claim
 and demand whatsoever of him the s^d Willis Windham of or to the premises to have & hold
 the said tract or parcel of Land & premises with the appurtenances unto the s^d Indian Indians
