This Indenture made this 26 day of June 1794 Between Frances Bracy & his wife Fanny of the one part and James M'Clenny of the other part Witnesseth that the said Frances Bracy & his wife Fanny for and in consideration of the sum of £18 lawful money of Virginia to them in hand paid by the s^r James M'Clenny the receipt whereof they do hereby acknowledge the said Frances Bracy & his wife Fanny hath granted sold aliened conveyed confirmed and by these presents doth grant sell Enjoyn & confirm unto the said James M'Clenny his heirs and assigns forever one certain tract or parcel of land lying in the county of Sta containing 60 acres to the same more or less bounded as follows beginning at a corner tree (oak) on Boons branch running down the same into Blackwater river up the same to a mark by a pine on the line between the said M'Clenny & the said Bracy thence along the same to Matthew Gardners line thence to the first flatness I have to hold the s^d land & premises unto belonging with the appurtenant & reversions remainder & remainders hereof unto thence also all the right title interest and claim of them the s^r Frances & Fanny Bracy & to the premises unto him the s^r James M'Clenny his heirs & assigns forever and that Frances Bracy & his wife Fanny for themselves their heirs & assigns the said tract of & parcel of land & premises above mentioned against them their heirs & assigns & assigns & against all every person & persons unto him the s^r James M'Clenny his heirs & assigns forever shall lawfully ever warrant and defend by these presents In Witness whereof the s^r Frances Bracy & Fanny Bracy hath hereunto set their hands & affixed Seal the day & year above written Signed Sealed & delivered
