This Indenture tripartite made this 13 day of June Anno Dom 1794 Between Littleton Soldiers James Woodson, Henry Woodson, Bob Wierake, Johnny Wierake Tho Turner Lucy Raper Eay Turner & Woodson, Norrmy Wort Betty Raps for ourselves and for and in behalf of William Galt & Mary Turner who are absent and also for and in behalf of Simon Raps Ann Woodson &c. In parts of the Wetlawyship of the first part & James Wilkinson, Thomas Vaughan James Miller John Taylor Ben Bidwell and Robert Godwyn Gent. trustees as herein after mention'd of the second part & Thomas Raper of the county of Sen of the third part Witnesseth that whereas by an act of the General Assembly of this state in an act concerning the Wetlawyship of Indians passed the 12th day of November Anno Domini 1792 James Wilkinson John Tho^s Bidwell Tho Vaughan James Miller John Taylor Ben Bidwell & Robert Godwyn Gent. were appointed trustees for the Indians of the said act was rendered lawful for the
